Advances in artificial intelligence (AI) are intended to simulate human cognitive functions and evaluation capabilities. This presentation provides examples of the use and "seductive allure" of AI in medical, psychotherapeutic, and criminal justice arenas, while also highlighting the implications for a "black box" effect in decision-making. An exploration of the connection between AI application in these fields and the role of interpreters and translators will be offered, along with a discourse regarding possible biases, fairness in processes, information accuracy, and preservation of human rights. Finally, a note will be devoted to how interpreters/ translators may inadvertently inherit ethical issues by virtue of their role and service.
